Our calling began with a burden for hurting teens that came to our youth ministry with the Richland Hills Church of Christ.

	Director. We reached over 500 students in schools, courts, and at The Campus.			
2013	Chris Robey updates our Life Lived Better Curriculum adding a version for middle school.			
	Our reach expands to impact 650 students this calendar year.			

# Teen Lifeline *Ministry Model*

- We serve school age adolescents that are in crisis, or beginning to make choices that will lead to crisis.
- We identify these teens through referrals from courts, school counselors, & youth ministers.
- We influence these teens through a monthly teen parent program or weekly teen support groups led in schools, courts, drug rehab and local churches.

# Teen Lifeline Ministry Funding Plan

- Our approved 2015 budget is \$312,000
- 100% of the Board are personally giving and along with our staff will actively raise funds from individual donors through personal meetings and fundraisers.
- For 2014 over \$250,000 was raised

# Teen Lifeline Ministry Results to Date

- 776 teenagers were exposed to the Teen Lifeline curriculum in 2014
- Every one of the teen parents, as well as students in some support groups were impacted with a strong message of the healing power of a relationship with Jesus.

# **Teen Lifeline Current Needs**

- \$45K for re-structuring of teen parent program
- \$15K for promotion and marketing to other schools and cities
- \$30K for operational expenses related to expected growth
